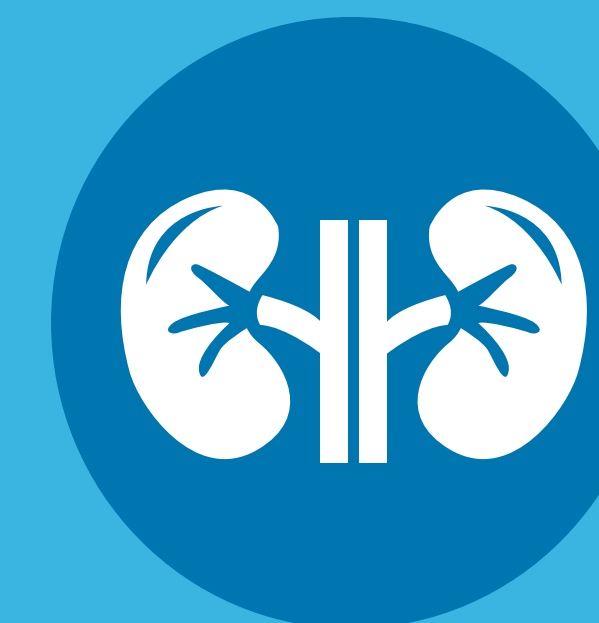
WRCP REQUIRES CHANGES TO OUR WATER DISINFECTION PROCESS

- District currently uses chlorine to disinfect water
- Converting to monochloramine in spring 2018
- Denver, Aurora and Castle Rock already use monochloramine
- Process will make our water compatible with regional partners

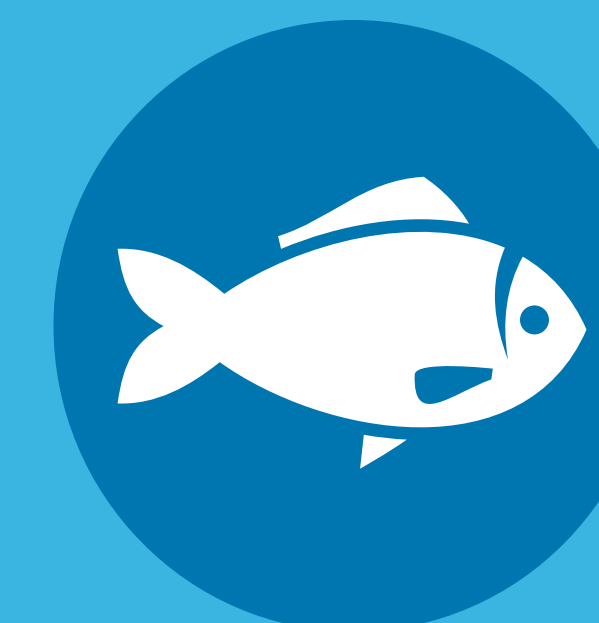
MONOCHLORAMINE IS:

- Very common and an effective disinfectant
- Safe and beneficial for all uses
- Often tastes better than chlorine and has fewer odor issues

LIKE CHLORINE, MONOCHLORAMINE MUST BE REMOVED FROM WATER FOR:



- Kidney dialysis treatment



- Live fresh water and salt water fish and amphibians



- Breweries and wineries
